The suggestion came purely in fun as they went on to describe being able to dress like their grandparent, even borrowing their clothes. The idea caught fire leading to the majority of the students voting to make that the theme. I left that meeting scratching my head as to what this party was going to look like, but I have learned in ministry and life that if you want students to grow into roles of leadership, you have to give them opportunities for ownership even when what they want to do is NOT what YOU would have done.


The idea and theme, personally, caught fire for me when listening to a friend and long time student pastor speak on a youth ministry podcast about introducing older generations to your students. He went on to talk about the benefits of introducing older Christians to your students as someone they can connect to, and how having them share their stories can help students see the faithfulness of God to lead them in their own lives. Therefore, over the next several weeks the students are going to hear from some older Christians in our congregation as they share about major moments of spiritual growth in their lives and God's faithfulness to them through the years. This will be a practical application of living out the verse above from Psalm 78.

God never ceases to amaze me in how He can take something silly and turn it into a serious direction of potential growth in ministry. So, would you pray along with me that these students and adults would be encouraged as they hear these testimonies? And pray with me that more relationships would be formed between our students and the older generation of Christians in our church. Finally, would you pray about making yourself available to serve in some capacity in student ministry, or being very purposeful each time we gather to slow down with a student? They need you! And, I think you will find the need to be mutual.

Adventus - Advent - Coming

Galatians 4:4 ⁴ *But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law,*

any churches have a traditional observance during the four weeks leading up to Christmas called Advent. Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus*, translated from the Greek word *parousia*, which means 'coming' or 'arrival.' Unfortunately, there is no mention of this Advent celebration in many low-church, protestant, evangelical churches. Many of our practically driven, CEO-business model, franchised churches of today have thrown-out centuries of tradition that helps focus the mind and heart on the person and work of Christ along with other holy things. So, where did Advent come from, and what does it mean?

There is no exact historical date when Advent began, but the earliest documentation about Advent is found in the Council of Saragossa in 380AD. The council was formed to discuss asceticism, address Priscillianism, determine Christian community boundaries, and discuss the roles of men and women in private and public. council issued eight canons (or official statements), and one included that every Christian should daily go to church from December 17th until January 6th. Later, some churches calendared 40 days to be observed from November 15th to December 25th for the Advent celebration by fasting certain days of the week. These 40 days neatly corresponded to the season of lent in preparation for Easter or Passover. It was during the sixth century with Pope Gregory the Great (590-604) that Advent became part of the yearly church calendar along with sermon series focusing on Advent, but which Advent?

A School for the Nations

Today, we find ourselves looking back to the 1st Advent and looking forward to the 2nd Advent. In earlier times, the first two weeks of Advent focused on the *parousia* (Gk) specifically the second coming of Christ, and the last two weeks leading up to Christmas day reflected on the 1st Advent.

During this advent season, remind yourself and your family members to seek the totality of Advent. Yes, Jesus did leave glory (Phil. 2:7), take on flesh (Phil. 2:8), was born a fragile baby boy in a manger (Luke 2:7), so let us join the heavenly anthem and sing *Gloria in Excelsis Deo* along with numerous other Christmas carols celebrating the birth of Christ. But do not miss he was born that he would die (Heb. 2:9), yet death had no power

over him (Heb. 2:14). Therefore, he resurrected from the dead (1 Cor. 15:4), ascended to heaven (Acts 1:9), and is preparing a place for his people to join him when he fulfills his promised 2nd Advent (John 14:3). In the final verses of holy scripture we read *He who testifies to these things says*, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen. - Revelation 22:20–21






Shoebox Ministry 2022 Reflections

--1,648 shoebox gifts were packed and shipped by the believers at Candies Creek Baptist Church



GENUINE WORSHIP, THE FRUIT OF REVIVAL

Praise the LORD! Praise Him, you servants of the LORD, praise the name of the LORD. Blessed be the name of the LORD from this time on and forever. From the rising of the sun to its setting, the name of the LORD is to be praised. The LORD is high above all nations; His glory is above the heavens (Psalm 113:1-4 NASB).

- As many local churches spend this month celebrating the greatness of God and the birth of Jesus Christ, pray that your church family will truly worship God in spirit and in truth, understanding and experiencing more fully the awesomeness of God in His glory (John 4:24).
- Seeing God as Jehovah Jireh, the One who provides for the needs of His children, pray that the families of your congregation will trust God and cry out to Him first for their physical, relational, and spiritual needs (Genesis 22:14).
- As the families of your church face the enemies of this world system—real enemies that try to rob them of a victorious relationship and walk with Christ—pray that they will cling tightly to Jehovah Nissi, and by faith rally under His banner of victory (Exodus 17:15).
- Pray that your church family will be faithful each week in honoring and observing a day of rest and worship, acknowledging that Jehovah M'kaddesh is the One who sanctifies and sets them apart as holy (Exodus 31:13).
- Just as Gideon, during a season of oppression by the Midianites, discovered that the Lord is peace, pray that the believers in your community who are being persecuted for their faith will also experience the peace that comes when Jehovah Shalom intervenes on their behalf (Judges 6:24).
- Jeremiah prophetically described the return of Israel's exiles under the leadership of Jehovah Tsidkenu, the Lord our righteousness (Jeremiah 23:6). Pray that those in your church who have wandered from God will repent of their backslidden condition and again pursue His righteousness.
- Just as young David found strength in God as he bravely confronted Goliath, pray that the churches in your community will also depend on Jehovah Sabaoth, the Lord of armies, as we confront the giants of sin in our culture (1 Samuel 17:45).

- Pray that your church family will hunger for God all the more in their pursuit of His manifest presence, and in doing so will find strength, comfort, and power from Jehovah Shammah, the Lord who is there (Ezekiel 48:35).
- Just as David's loving Shepherd guided and cared for him, pray that your church family will recognize Jehovah Rohi as their Shepherd while facing today's challenges and the ongoing need for direction (Psalm 23:1).
- As relational and financial insecurity for families is becoming the norm, pray that those in your congregation facing this challenge will find renewed hope in their relationship with the Ancient of Days, the One who has always been there to understand and care (Daniel 7:9).
- For your church family, pray that the meditation of their hearts and the words from their mouths will be acceptable in God's sight (Psalm 19:14).
- Pray that your Christian friends will "trust in the LORD forever, for in GOD the LORD, we have an everlasting Rock" (Isaiah 26:4).
- Knowing that God has not forsaken those who seek Him, pray that your church family will always pursue God and rest in Him as "a stronghold for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble" (Psalm 9:9-10).
- As a sun and shield to each believer and One who gives grace and glory to those who walk uprightly, pray that God will not withhold any good thing from those in your church family who are walking before Him with integrity (Psalm 84:11).
- With many undermining the fact that God is our Creator (Genesis 1:1), or that He even exists, please pray that the churches of your community will become bolder in loving people. Pray that through their unity and changed behavior, Christians will show the world the reality of God.

- With churches often not thinking about the refining, maturing work God does in the lives of His children, pray that the members of your congregation will grow in their understanding of God as One who is "like a refiner's fire, and like launderer's soap" (Malachi 3:2).
- Just like a father who has compassion on his children, God has compassion on those who fear Him (Psalm 103:13). Pray that today's church, which so needs God's compassion, will learn better how to fear and reverence Him.
- Having graciously received comfort from the One who is "the Father of mercies and God of all comfort," pray that we in turn will comfort others with the same kind of comfort we have received from Him (2 Corinthians 1:3-4).
- Pray that your church family will not be deceived into thinking that the supernatural blessings they experience are produced by the efforts of man. Instead, pray that they will give thanks to the Father of lights, from whom every good thing and perfect gift comes (James 1:16-17).
- Ask the Father of glory to give you and your church family "a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowedge of Him" and His holy ways (Ephesians 1:17).
- Pray that the spiritual eyes of your congregation will be so enlightened that they will "know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the boundless greatness of His power toward us who believe" (Ephesians 1:18-19).
- Pray that those in your church family who may be feeling rejected and alone will have the same kind of comforting encounter Hagar had with the angel of the Lord. She was so encouraged in her loneliness that she described God as El Roi, "a God who sees" (Genesis 16:7-13).
- Just as God was known to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob as El Shaddai, God Almighty, pray that He will be just as powerfully known as a covenant-keeping God among the Christians in our nation (Exodus 6:2-4).

- Even as Melchizedek, a priest of El Elyon, blessed God and Abram after the defeat Chedorlaomer and the kings who were with him, pray that your church family will also bless God Most High, who gives us victory during our fiercest struggles (Genesis 14:17-20).
- As we celebrate the birth of Christ today, take a few moments to praise God for Jesus, the Son of the Most High, the One whose kingdom will have no end (Luke 1:32-33).
- Knowing that Jesus will someday come again "in the glory of His Father with the holy angels," pray that even now, while living in an adulterous and sinful generation, the members of your church family will not be ashamed to declare that Jesus is Lord (Mark 8:38).
- Pray that when the members of your church family refer to Jesus as "Lord," they will do so with humility, truly acknowledging that He is the head of the church and worthy of our submission (Luke 7:6-7).
- Jesus is described in the Bible as the Word and the Light of men (John 1:1, 4). Pray that Christians will hunger to encounter Jesus every time they read their Bibles. Pray that they will be open to receive the exposing, convicting, spiritual light His presence brings.
- Pray that your church family will recognize Jesus as the interceding, great high priest He truly is, the One who is "holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens" (Hebrews 7:25-26).
- Pray that justice will be established on the earth as Jesus, the Servant of God, continues to "bring forth justice to the nations" (Isaiah 42:1).
- Before we begin a new year, please take time to thank God for sending His Son into the world to save us from our sins. Praise Him for Immanuel, the One who truly is God with us (Matthew 1:23).
