Well Child Policy for Candies Creek Kids

For the protection of the children and families in our kids ministry, please adhere to these guidelines when determining if you should bring your child to church.

A well child has:

- · No fever over 99.40 currently or within the last 24 hours.
- · No vomiting or diarrhea currently or within the last 24 hours.
- · No runny nose.
- · No cough.
- · No unexplained rashes.
- · No skin infections.
- · No eye infections.
- · No childhood diseases such as chicken pox, mumps, measles, etc

If your child lives in the same household as an adult or child who is currently positive for Covid-19, please do not bring them to church until their doctor recommended quarantine is completed.

If a child currently has any of the above symptoms ...

Please do not bring your child to church. The volunteers, teachers, and leaders in your child's class may not accept him or her into the classroom.

If a child develops any of the above symptoms while in our care ...

We will ask you to pick up your child immediately. We will not administer medicine of any kind.



The Second Art of the Trivium: Dialectic/Logic

Proverbs 15:22 Without counsel plans fail, but with many advisers they succeed.

This month we turn to the second pathway of the Trivium (three ways). The second pathway is often called Dialectic or Logic. At this stage, students are often in 6th-8th grades. Students who are between the ages of 11-14 naturally beginning to make connections between knowledge they have gained in the Grammar stage.

This Dialectic stage is primarily about reasoning. Students are to be led by their teachers to find the arguments, follow the questions, and develop the ability to ask good questions. At this time, we begin to introduce students to formal and informal logic in order to see the arguments, ask pertinent questions, and form a response. This stage flourishes through directed and abundant dialogue between teacher and students, as well as students and students. Our culture increasingly seeks to cancel robust dialogue and prefers shouting matches or name calling posts to silence anyone courageous enough to challenge a stance with a reasoned argument or good question.

In classical education, there is what is known as the Socratic method. It is named after Socrates, an ancient (470-399BC) Greek philosopher who is often seen as one of the founders of western philosophy and thought. The Socratic method is where a teacher dialogues with a student and offers questions and answers to get a student to process arguments and wade through contradictory ideas to discover the truth.

Our desire at CCA is not merely to teach students what to think or be good test-takers. Our goal goes much farther, seeking to teach students how to think thoroughly, maturely, and Biblically. In other words, we want our students to become wise, which takes counsel and many advisers. The Dialectic stage is another step toward that goal, and your prayers for CCA faculty, staff, and students will empower our efforts.





The Shoebox Sisters are rejoicing!!! Why?, you might ask...

The primary purpose of this position is to develop, direct, and oversee the music ministries of Candies Creek Baptist Church. As we seek to make disciples and proclaim Christ to all people, this pastoral position requires the individual to serve not only as a music leader, but also as a shepherd to God's people who serve in this area of ministry, as well as to the entire congregation.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Plan, schedule, lead and coordinate (in conjunction with the Senior Pastor) Christ-exalting music for all worship services by choosing songs that will engage the congregation and support the preaching of God's Word.
- 2. Encourage all generations in the church by recruiting, teaching and training musicians/singers to serve the Lord in the areas where they are gifted.
- 3. Coordinate and direct weekly rehearsals with the choir, praise band, praise teams, sound/technology volunteers.
- 4. Cultivate a Christ-centered community within all areas of responsibility.
- 5. Attend weekly staff meetings and participate in the planning and implementation of church ministry and programs aligned with the vision and mission statement of the church for the betterment of the congregation as well as the community.
- 6. Organize, administer and manage all areas of the worship ministry.
- 7. Provide inspiration, leadership and encouragement for participation in God-honoring music ministries of the church: choir, accompanists, special music, praise band, children's choir, etc.
- 8. Actively participate in church outreach, prayer meetings and visitation ministries.
- 9. Be responsible for the care, upkeep, organization and inventory of all church musical equipment.
- 10. Perform other duties as assigned by the Senior Pastor.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Be a believer in Jesus Christ with a genuine, vibrant and growing relationship with Him.
- 2. Have a desire to disciple and live the Gospel for the glory of God.
- 3. Be committed to moral purity and maintain moral and ethical standards and practices as evidenced in Scripture.
- 4. Have theological views compatible with the Baptist Faith and Message, with a desire for continued growth and maturity as a godly person through prayer and study of God's Word.
- Actively participate in a community group on Sunday morning or on another night of the week.
- 6. Have the ability to read and direct both choral and instrumental music.
- 7. Honor others by communicating effectively and professionally in all circumstances.
- 8. Be able to work as a team player with the pastor and associate staff members.
- 9. Be a self-starter and self-motivated because of your relationship with Christ.
- 10. Be interested and willing to engage people of all ages.
- 11. Hold a bachelor's degree and/or seminary degree with musical emphasis (preferred but not required)

PRAYING TOWARD THE COLLEGIATE DAY OF PRAYER ON FEBRUARY 25

Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe (1 Timothy 4:12 NASB).

Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary (Isaiah 40:30-31).

- College students have had a special place in many of America's great revivals. Pray that today's churches will not despise or look down on this younger generation, but will encourage Christian students to boldly model a genuine faith in Christ (1 Timothy 4:12).
- Pray for a divine visitation of the glory of God on college campuses that will cause even the hardest of hearts to surrender to Him and declare that there is a God (Habakkuk 2:14)!
- In a culture that promotes abusive, angry, and unwholesome talk, pray that today's Christian college students will exemplify the kind of speech that builds up and edifies those around them (Ephesians 4:29).
- Pray that Christian college students across the nation will be consistent in their walk and excellent in their speech, living lives that are free from deception (Proverbs 17:7).
- Pray that Christian college students will not be careless when it comes to their conduct or ways, but will be diligent in learning and obeying the commandments and ways of God (Proverbs 19:16).
- Most children who grow up in church leave the faith during their college years. This weekend, ask God to guide wayward students back into the fellowship of the local church (Hebrews 10:25).
- Pray that Christian college students will distinguish themselves before others, not by mastering the ways of the world, but by consistently living according to the pure and righteous principles of God (Proverbs 20:11).

- Pray that on college campuses, Christian students will conduct themselves "in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ" and will stand firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel (Philippians 1:27).
- Pray for God to raise up individuals on college campuses who, like Daniel, would be set apart for God's purposes and would fast and pray for breakthrough on their campus (Daniel 10:2-3).
- With so many vain philosophies being thrown at them by their peers, teachers, and culture, pray that Christian college students will not be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ (2 Corinthians 11:3).
- Pray that Christian students will not forsake wisdom, but will acquire and love the wisdom that comes from above (Proverbs 4:6-7).
- Pray that Christian college students will demonstrate through their daily lives that they love God with all their heart, soul, and mind (Matthew 22:37).
- Pray that God will especially equip your church to minister to the college-aged members of your community. Ask Him to raise up couples and individuals who will mentor and walk beside these young adults (2 Timothy 2:2).
- Pray that Christian college students both on and off campus will demonstrate their love for others by interceding specifically and consistently for the salvation and spiritual well-being of every person they consider a neighbor (Matthew 22:39).

- As Christian college students are touched by increasing degrees of lawlessness within our culture, pray that their love for Christ will not grow cold, but will actually burn more passionately as they commit themselves to faithfully walk in the ways of God (Matthew 24:12).
- Pray that no root of bitterness or competition would hinder the Lord's work in campus ministries, but that they would freely forgive and see one another as God sees (Matthew 18:21-22).
- As Christians students pray and minister together on their campuses, pray that they will be encouraged to press on in their obedience to Christ, being strengthened by each other's faith (Romans 1:12).
- Pray for God to raise up leaders on campus who have the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of God (Ephesians 1:17).
- Pray that Christian students will see themselves as servants of God and will reflect His presence within them in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, in the word of truth, and in the power of God (2 Corinthians 6:4, 6-7).
- As Christian college students seek God's will and receive direction for ministry from Him, pray that they will have mountain-moving faith, the kind through which God accomplishes the impossible (Matthew 17:20).
- Pray that spiritually lost college students will no longer have their minds blinded into unbelief by the god of this world, but will have their hearts opened by the one true God to see "the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:4).

- Pray that this generation of college students will hold marriage in honor and keep the marriage bed undefiled (Hebrews 13:4).
- Pray that every college-aged adult living in America will understand that "wine is a mocker, strong drink a brawler, and whoever is intoxicated by it is not wise" (Proverbs 20:1).
- 24 Knowing that God "tests the righteous and the wicked" and hates "the one who loves violence," pray that this generation of college students will turn away from watching the violence found in much of today's media and entertainment (Psalm 11:5).
- As each college campus in America is adopted in prayer today, ask God to send a great spiritual awakening that draws millions of college students into a vibrant relationship with Himself!
- Pray that on every campus across America, worship and prayer would begin to arise day and night, and laborers be sent forth into the vineyards, until God's name is made great among the nations (Malachi 1:11).
- Pray that this weekend, lost college students would be inexplicably drawn by the Spirit of God to join local church services. Pray that they will hear the gospel and respond in faith that leads to salvation (John 6:44).
- In coming to know Jesus, pray that this generation of college students will wait for the Lord, gain new strength, mount up with wings like eagles, run and not get tired, and walk in the Spirit of Christ so as not to become weary in loving and serving their mighty God (Isaiah 40:31).
