

Our Ideal Graduate

"But he who is noble plans noble things, and on noble things he stands." -Isaiah 32:8

Ziglar is noted for saying, "If you aim at nothing, you will hit it every time." Creating well-defined objectives takes time and effort, but they are worth the struggle. Over time they provide faculty and staff with direction, clarity, focus, and motivation. They also engender a sense of accomplishment for all involved when goals are met or exceeded.

It is the goal of the faculty and staff at Candies Creek Academy (CCA) to partner with parents to produce ideal graduates who are 1) committed to Christ; 2) critical thinkers; 3) confident communicators; and 4) citizens of virtue:

Committed to Christ: Jesus Christ is the focal point of all that is, has been, and ever will be. We believe that education begins with this reality. We desire our graduates to be active disciples of Christ in community with His church and glorify God by loving, trusting, and obeying Him.

Critical Thinkers: Our primary responsibility is not to teach students what to think but how to think. Courses in Bible, language arts, arithmetic, science, history, logic, music, and art provide graduates with a broad-spectrum education that provides them the needed tools for biblical reasoning in response to cultural ideas and agendas.

Confident Communicators: Not only do we equip students to reason well, we also teach them to communicate their thoughts clearly and concisely. Our aim is that graduates will be confident in their speaking and writing abilities to engage in meaningful debates characterized by civility, graciousness, and truth.

Citizens of Virtue: All virtues that are pleasing to God are a work of His Spirit within Christ-followers. Virtues are not rules and regulations. They are outpourings of positive character that mark a Christian who experiences the abundant life in Christ. Our responsibility is to introduce students to virtue, guide them in the path of virtuous living, and provide them with living models of Christ-like character, with the desire that they might one day become virtuous neighbors, colleagues, and citizens. We do not focus on teaching our graduates how to make a living but how to make a life.

CCA provides a grace-filled learning environment where students are encouraged to love learning to become lifelong learners. It is our prayer that as students grow physically, spiritually, and intellectually, they will become people that exemplify grace, truth, and virtue.

However, these ends will take the participation of the parents to accomplish. The faculty and staff at CCA cannot succeed absent assistance. Students will need guidance and correction at both school and home to reach these academic and spiritual goals; but they can be achieved through hard work, discipline, and, most of all, the inner-working of the Holy Spirit.



Do Finally, you must help your friend **Do** something with what she learns—to **apply** the insights God has given to her daily life and relationships... God calls your friend not just to be a hearer of his Word, but to be an active doer of it as well. p. 112



PRAYING TOWARD THE COLLEGIATE DAY OF PRAYER ON FEBRUARY 24

Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe (1 Timothy 4:12 NASB).

Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, yet those who wait for the LORD will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary (Isaiah 40:30-31).

- **1** College students have had a special place in many of America's great revivals. Pray that today's churches will not despise or look down on this younger generation, but will encourage Christian students to boldly model a genuine faith in Christ (1 Timothy 4:12).
- 2 In a culture that promotes abusive, angry, and unwholesome talk, pray that today's Christian college students will exemplify the kind of speech that builds up and edifies those around them (Ephesians 4:29).
- **3** Pray that Christian college students across the nation will be consistent in their walk and excellent in their speech, living lives that are free from deception (Proverbs 17:7).
- 4 Pray that Christian college students will not be careless when it comes to their conduct or ways, but will be diligent in learning and obeying the commandments and ways of God (Proverbs 19:16).
- 5 Most children who grow up in church leave the faith during their college years. This weekend, ask God to guide wayward students back into the fellowship of the local church (Hebrews 10:25).
- 6 Pray that Christian college students will distinguish themselves before others, not by mastering the ways of the world, but by consistently living according to the pure and righteous principles of God (Proverbs 20:11).
 - Pray that on college campuses, Christian students will conduct themselves "in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ" and will stand firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel (Philippians 1:27).

- Pray for God to raise up individuals on college campuses who, like Daniel, would be set apart for God's purposes and would fast and pray for breakthrough on their campus (Daniel 10:2-3).
- 9 With so many vain philosophies being thrown at them by their peers, teachers, and culture, pray that Christian college students will not be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ (2 Corinthians 11:3).
- **10** Pray that Christian students will not forsake wisdom, but will acquire and love the wisdom that comes from above (Proverbs 4:6-7).
- Pray that Christian college students will demonstrate through their daily lives that they love God with all their heart, soul, and mind (Matthew 22:37).
 - Pray that God will especially equip your church to minister to the college-aged members of your community. Ask Him to raise up couples and individuals who will mentor and walk beside these young adults (2 Timothy 2:2).
 - Pray that Christian college students both on and off campus will demonstrate their love for others by interceding specifically and consistently for the salvation and spiritual well-being of every person they consider a neighbor (Matthew 22:39).
- As Christian college students are touched by increasing degrees of lawlessness within our culture, pray that their love for Christ will not grow cold, but will actually burn more passionately as they commit themselves to faithfully walk in the ways of God (Matthew 24:12).



- Pray that no root of bitterness or competition would hinder the Lord's work in campus ministries, but that they would freely forgive and see one another as God sees (Matthew 18:21-22).
- **16** As Christians students pray and minister together on their campuses, pray that they will be encouraged to press on in their obedience to Christ, being strengthened by each other's faith (Romans 1:12).
- **17** Pray for God to raise up leaders on campus who have the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of God (Ephesians 1:17).
- **18** Pray that Christian students will see themselves as servants of God and will reflect His presence within them in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, in the word of truth, and in the power of God (2 Corinthians 6:4, 6-7).
- **19** As Christian college students seek God's will and receive direction for ministry from Him, pray that they will have mountain-moving faith, the kind through which God accomplishes the impossible (Matthew 17:20).
- 20 Pray that spiritually lost college students will no longer have their minds blinded into unbelief by the god of this world, but will have their hearts opened by the one true God to see "the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:4).
- Pray that this generation of college students will hold marriage in honor and keep the marriage bed undefiled (Hebrews 13:4).
- 22 Pray that every young adult living in America will understand that "wine is a mocker, strong drink a brawler, and whoever is intoxicated by it is not wise" (Proverbs 20:1).

- 3 Knowing that God "tests the righteous and the wicked" and hates "the one who loves violence," pray that this generation of college students will turn away from watching the violence found in much of today's media and entertainment (Psalm 11:5).
 - As each college campus in America is adopted in prayer today, ask God to send a great spiritual awakening that draws millions of college students into a vibrant relationship with Himself!
 - 5 Pray that on every campus across America, worship and prayer would begin to arise day and night, and laborers be sent forth into the vineyards, until God's name is made great among the nations (Malachi 1:11).
- Pray that this weekend, lost college students would be inexplicably drawn by the Spirit of God to join local church services. Pray that they will hear the gospel and respond in faith that leads to salvation (John 6:44).
- **7** Pray for a divine visitation of the glory of God on college campuses that will cause even the hardest of hearts to surrender to Him and declare that there is a God (Habakkuk 2:14)!
- 28 In coming to know Jesus, pray that this generation of college students will wait for the Lord, gain new strength, mount up with wings like eagles, run and not get tired, and walk in the Spirit of Christ so as not to become weary in loving and serving their mighty God (Isaiah 40:31).
