February serves as a busy month on the calendar, but they are things that are necessary. I am firmly convinced from Scripture that the family is the most foundational established relationship in our lives. Therefore, the primary responsibility of the parents is to raise their child(ren) up in the truth of Scripture and disciple them "as they are going." That is why I want to take a Sunday afternoon and share ways that I seek to disciple their students in the student ministry on a broad scale, and converse with one another on how they can disciple their child one on one in the home. Please pray that, we, as parents, understand our primary role as disciple makers of our children, and that I, as a student pastor, do my best to support what they are doing and serve as a helper in their responsibility.

We have two opportunities this month for students to have a shared experience in order to grow in community with one another. Those opportunities are our Super Bowl Party and the Late Nighter. At the Super Bowl party there will be ample opportunities for students to connect with one another, and they have a chance to bring their friends and hear the gospel. Simultaneously, students will compete in a corn hole tournament with the winners receiving a free ride to camp. Our Late Nighter will also provide an opportunity for students to grow in community through a fun shared experience. We will pause at some point in the night to pray on behalf of others and ourselves that we will grow in Hope in the Lord.

This month we will also start with teaching on our theme for the year of "Hope Grows." The text we will launch out of is 2 Timothy 1:12 that says, "But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me." Paul is challenging Timothy to embrace the suffering that comes with following Christ and proclaiming the gospel. This verse points to the reason why Paul is not ashamed, and why Timothy should not be ashamed either. The reason is because immortality, or eternal life, has been given to him and will not be taken away because God is faithful on His Word. I so want our students to be thoroughly convinced that standing on the promises of God's Word, and living according to Scripture in a culture that finds that offensive, is so worth it. Would you pray along with me for our students to have confidence in the Word of God and the boldness to act on God's truths? Pray that their HOPE would only grow as they find themselves being persecuted or made fun of. Thank you!

### What do you treasure?

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." - Matthew 6:21

s we settle into this new year of 2023, it will be good to take account of what we truly treasure. Many people verbally say they treasure many things; but when it comes to daily life, we have limited time and resources. Therefore, people have said, "The checkbook and the calendar never lie," or another saying of uncertain origin, "Show me your checkbook, and I'll tell you your values." I could even add, "Your internet search history reveals what you love." Where you spend your time, resources, and online activity is a good indicator of what you truly value.

People throughout history have had many and varied treasures—from the Roman emperors treasuring emperor worship to St. Francis of Assisi treasuring a life of asceticism. In our modern age, specifically our American culture, we are divided on what we value based mainly on an individual's moral framework, but one thing has not changed: everyone values something.

We are a people who treasure our sports, our music, our movies, our recreational activities, and our entertainments. In short, many see work as a necessary evil, so that we can consume or spend time with what we treasure. On the flip side, there are also those people who treasure their work to such a degree that they inadvertently harm those who are closest to them.

Nearly everyone I know would wholeheartedly claim to treasure their children or grandchildren, but do our words and actions say otherwise? Providing for your children's needs or lavishing them with gifts does not automatically translate to treasuring them. One of the best ways to love our children or grandchildren is to follow Christ by being a faithful and active member of a local church. Consider the following quote by Kevin DeYoung:

"The man who attempts Christianity without the church shoots himself in the foot, shoots his children in the leg, and shoots his grandchildren in the heart."

A second way to treasure your children or grandchildren is by providing them with a Christ-centered, historically rich, robust education that is grounded in truth. No single English word fits what the Bible commands parents to do for their children, but Deuteronomy 6:4-7 directs us:

4 "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. 5 You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 7 You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

The word used in classical education to best describe a scriptural understanding of this idea is the transliterated Greek word "paideia," indicating an education based on more than simple information and skills. It is best understood as the God-honoring enculturation of knowledge, understanding, values, culture, and wisdom.

I am grateful for a church and school that treasures Christ and children. We have a great opportunity here at Candies Creek Academy to equip, model, and mobilize students to be effective disciples through Christ-centered education with academic excellence. As individual families, we each need to assess what we treasure these days. If your family desires your children or grandchildren to have the privilege of attending a Christ-centered, classical school, but you believe costs prevent you from doing so, please get in touch with our staff to begin the steps to apply for a scholarship. If you know a family in our area who would love to have their children in a private Christian school, please have them contact our office so we can begin working on making their desire a reality.

Jesus also spoke to these concepts. This first is his instruction of what it will cost to be one of his

disciples in Luke 14:33: "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple." The idea of renouncing is not just giving up something but truly letting go of what we treasure physically or emotionally so that what we possess will no longer possess us.

We also see in Matthew 19:13-14 how Jesus paused to treasure children in the midst of a crowded group of educated men who had questions about the law and his own disciples who were trying to understand and do important kingdom work. It is written, "Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked the people, but Jesus said, 'Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven.'"

Oh, brothers and sisters, let us redeem the time (Eph. 5:16) and renounce all that we treasure apart from Christ and his commands. Let us teach our children diligently (Deut. 6:7) bringing them "up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4), so that all nations will come and worship the Lord for his righteous acts have been revealed (Rev 15:4).

Jerry Bridges adds a few layers to this in his book, <u>Trusting God</u>. He gives three truths we must believe if we are going to trust God in adversity. They are: (1) God is **completely sovereign**, (2) God is **infinite in wisdom** and (3) God is **perfect in love**. His primary purpose of the book is for us to become so convinced of these truths that we appropriate them in our daily circumstances, that we learn to trust God in the midst of our pain, whatever form it may take. (p. 9)

I hope that you got to work on memorizing Romans 8:18-19 in January. We'll add Romans 8:20-21 in February to our congregational memory work. May we strive together and encourage one another in our pursuit of Christ!

#### PRAYING TOWARD THE COLLEGIATE DAY OF PRAYER ON FEBRUARY 23

Let no one look down on your youthfulness, but rather in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity, show yourself an example of those who believe (1 Timothy 4:12 NASB).

Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly, yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary (Isaiah 40:30-31).

- College students have had a special place in many of America's great revivals. Pray that today's churches will not despise or look down on this younger generation, but will encourage Christian students to boldly model a genuine faith in Christ (1 Timothy 4:12).
- In a culture that promotes abusive, angry, and unwholesome talk, pray that today's Christian college students will exemplify the kind of speech that builds up and edifies those around them (Ephesians 4:29).
- Pray that Christian college students across the nation will be consistent in their walk and excellent in their speech, living lives that are free from deception (Proverbs 17:7).
- Pray that Christian college students will not be careless when it comes to their conduct or ways, but will be diligent in learning and obeying the commandments and ways of God (Proverbs 19:16).
- Most children who grow up in church leave the faith during their college years. This weekend, ask God to guide wayward students back into the fellowship of the local church (Hebrews 10:25).
- Pray that Christian college students will distinguish themselves before others, not by mastering the ways of the world, but by consistently living according to the pure and righteous principles of God (Proverbs 20:11).
- Pray that on college campuses, Christian students will conduct themselves "in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ" and will stand firm in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel (Philippians 1:27).

- Pray for God to raise up individuals on college campuses who, like Daniel, would be set apart for God's purposes and would fast and pray for breakthrough on their campus (Daniel 10:2-3).
- With so many vain philosophies being thrown at them by their peers, teachers, and culture, pray that Christian college students will not be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ (2 Corinthians 11:3).
- Pray that Christian students will not forsake wisdom, but will acquire and love the wisdom that comes from above (Proverbs 4:6-7).
- Pray that Christian college students will demonstrate through their daily lives that they love God with all their heart, soul, and mind (Matthew 22:37).
- Pray that God will especially equip your church to minister to the college-aged members of your community. Ask Him to raise up couples and individuals who will mentor and walk beside these young adults (2 Timothy 2:2).
- Pray that Christian college students both on and off campus will demonstrate their love for others by interceding specifically and consistently for the salvation and spiritual well-being of every person they consider a neighbor (Matthew 22:39).
- As Christian college students are touched by increasing degrees of lawlessness within our culture, pray that their love for Christ will not grow cold, but will actually burn more passionately as they commit themselves to faithfully walk in the ways of God (Matthew 24:12).

- Pray that no root of bitterness or competition would hinder the Lord's work in campus ministries, but that they would freely forgive and see one another as God sees (Matthew 18:21-22).
- As Christians students pray and minister together on their campuses, pray that they will be encouraged to press on in their obedience to Christ, being strengthened by each other's faith (Romans 1:12).
- Pray for God to raise up leaders on campus who have the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of God (Ephesians 1:17).
- Pray that Christian students will see themselves as servants of God and will reflect His presence within them in purity, in knowledge, in patience, in kindness, in the Holy Spirit, in genuine love, in the word of truth, and in the power of God (2 Corinthians 6:4, 6-7).
- As Christian college students seek God's will and receive direction for ministry from Him, pray that they will have mountain-moving faith, the kind through which God accomplishes the impossible (Matthew 17:20).
- Pray that spiritually lost college students will no longer have their minds blinded into unbelief by the god of this world, but will have their hearts opened by the one true God to see "the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:4).
- Pray that this generation of college students will hold marriage in honor and keep the marriage bed undefiled (Hebrews 13:4).
- Pray that every young adult living in America will understand that "wine is a mocker, strong drink a brawler, and whoever is intoxicated by it is not wise" (Proverbs 20:1).

- As each college campus in America is adopted in prayer today, ask God to send a great spiritual awakening that draws millions of college students into a vibrant relationship with Himself!
- Knowing that God "tests the righteous and the wicked" and hates "the one who loves violence," pray that this generation of college students will turn away from watching the violence found in much of today's media and entertainment (Psalm 11:5).
- Pray that on every campus across America, worship and prayer would begin to arise day and night, and laborers be sent forth into the vineyards, until God's name is made great among the nations (Malachi 1:11).
- Pray that this weekend, lost college students would be inexplicably drawn by the Spirit of God to join local church services. Pray that they will hear the gospel and respond in faith that leads to salvation (John 6:44).
- Pray for a divine visitation of the glory of God on college campuses that will cause even the hardest of hearts to surrender to Him and declare that there is a God (Habakkuk 2:14)!
- In coming to know Jesus, pray that this generation of college students will wait for the Lord, gain new strength, mount up with wings like eagles, run and not get tired, and walk in the Spirit of Christ so as not to become weary in loving and serving their mighty God (Isaiah 40:31).
