



Education - Passing On the Baton of Worship

"You, however, have followed my teaching, my conduct, my aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness,... But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. -2 Timothy 3:10, 14–15

he Church proper consists of men and women who have professed that Christ is their Lord and Savior, have followed the Lord in believer's baptism, have willingly examined and presented themselves regularly before the Lord's table, and continue to desire to obey all he has commanded. These disciples of Christ have a corporate responsibility to pass on our culture of worship as laid out in Scripture. The Church is responsible for raising up each generation in the faith and practice of worshiping Christ in all of life.

True worship touches all of life. It is not limited to a "worship service" in a building. True worship begins with a relationship with the one Eternal God through repentance and surrender to Jesus Christ. True worship is a way of life and is seen by what we value most. So, how is the church passing the lifestyle of worship on to subsequent generations?

We see it begin at the earliest stage of life when parents present their children to the Lord and the church during what is commonly referred to as a Baby Dedication, Infant Baptism, Christening, Baptismal Promise, or for CCBC, a Parent, Child, Church Dedication. Minus some important and debatable theological distinctions, the general thrust of these ceremonies express the desire of the parents to invite the church (i.e., the body of Christ) to participate in passing on doctrine and conduct of true worship to this child. This is certainly a good start. But often, parents fail to have a robust view of worship as a lifestyle.

For example, each child needs the church to pass on true worship as a lifestyle as they progress in each stage of their education and into a career, equipped to resist the allurement of contemporary idols--the greatest of these being the love of money, pleasure, and autonomy. They need to be taught that all of life is worship.

Part of true worship is the body of Christ casting a vision and working toward a mission of educating children under the rule and reign of Christ. Some of the most historic universities in the United States were begun by

congregations who took up their responsibility to pass on worship as a lifestyle that permeates all of life. The following has been quoted frequently:

"106 of the first 108 colleges were started on the Christian faith. By the close of 1860, there were 246 colleges in America. Seventeen of these were state institutions; almost every other one was founded by Christian denominations or by individuals who avowed a religious purpose."

Another famous quote supporting the church being directly involved and laboring for the next generation's education is found in Harvard's "Rules and Precepts," adopted in 1646:

"Let every Student be plainly instructed, and earnestly pressed to consider well, the maine end of his life and studies is, to know God and Jesus Christ which is eternal life (John 17:3) and therefore to lay Christ in the bottome, as the only foundation of all sound knowledge and Learning. And seeing the Lord only giveth wisedome, Let every one seriously set himself by prayer in secret to seeke it of him (Prov. 2:3)."

The credibility of this quote is disputed by some people today, and there was not a reliable source as a reference. Regardless, it captures the idea of the ultimate purpose for education.

One well-known documented fact about Harvard is the 1692 motto of the school. The original Latin motto was, *Veritas Christo et Ecclesiae*, which translated from Latin means, "Truth for Christ and the Church." At some point, the motto was shortened to only *Veritas*, or "Truth."

All of life is worship. The object of worship can either be the one true God or something else.

Consider the following quote from G. Campbell Morgan (1863-1945):

"Every man is bound somewhere, somehow, to a throne, to a government, to an authority, to something that is supreme, to something to which he offers sacrifice, and burns incense, and bends the knee."

Church, it is our responsibility to pass on worship as a lifestyle in the area of education to another generation. We must pass on the values, knowledge, and tools to combat the secularism of a culture that sees the world as ultimate, rather than Christ. We have the privilege to teach our children to not only remain steadfast in corporate worship, but to see all of life as an act of worship.








DISCIPLINING OURSELVES FOR THE PURPOSE OF GODLINESS

Discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness; for bodily discipline is only of little profit, but godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come (1 Timothy 4:7-8 NASB).

- Father, thank You for another year. Help me to know You more, to love others, and to live for Your glory (1 Corinthians 10:31).
- Pray that Christians in your community will be challenged this year to repent of wickedness and to discipline themselves to walk in godliness (1 Timothy 4:8).
- Pray that time with Christ in His Word, Spirit-led worship, prayer, and ministry to others will become a part of your church family's daily walk with God (1 Timothy 4:7).

Spending Time in the Word

- Many professing Christians think they can adequately serve God without spending regular time with Him in His Word. Pray that your church family will embrace God's Word as a powerful tool He wants to use in their lives in order to equip them for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
- The psalmist saw God's Word as a lamp to his feet and a light to his path (Psalm 119:105). In the growing darkness of our culture, pray that Christians will regularly fill their hearts and minds with the Word of God in order to walk in the light with Jesus.
- When Jesus was in the wilderness being tempted by the devil, He responded by quoting from the book of Deuteronomy (Matthew 4:3-11). Pray that as God's children, we will be diligent in memorizing His Word in order to effectively resist temptations.

- Jesus said in Luke 11:28 that those who hear the Word of God and observe it will be blessed, or joyful. Pray that the members of your church will experience great joy as they daily submit themselves to keep God's Word.
- Jesus said that those who continue living according to His Word are truly His disciples (John 8:31). Pray that followers of Jesus in your community will be faithful to build their lives around the principles and teachings of His Word.
- Pray that Christians in your community will have God's Word abiding in them and will prove themselves doers of the Word, not merely hearers who delude themselves (James 1:22).
- Sometimes Christians fall away from their walk with Jesus when they are persecuted for believing God's Word (Matthew 13:21). With this type of persecution on the rise, pray that Christians will be bold and steadfast in making God's Word a part of their daily walk and conversation.

Worshiping in the Spirit

- Pray that every member of your church family will be a true worshiper, faithfully worshiping the Father in spirit and in truth (John 4:23).
- Pray that the members of your church will be faithful to present their bodies to God as living and holy sacrifices, acceptable to God, which is their spiritual service of worship (Romans 12:1).



- Pray that your Christian friends will worship in the Spirit, glorify Jesus by entrusting their lives to Him, and put no confidence in their own fleshly power (Philippians 3:3).
- Take time today for your soul to magnify the Lord and for your spirit to rejoice in God your Savior (Luke 1:46-47).
- Pray that those in your city who have worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator will be convicted of their sin and turn to acknowledge that God alone is the Creator, who is to be blessed forever (Romans 1:25).
- In Jeremiah's day, people often worshiped the works of their own hands (Jeremiah 1:16). Pray that Christians today will turn away from this temptation and will exalt the One who is at work within them both to will and to work for His own good pleasure (Philippians 2:13).
- Let's pause right now and heed the exhortation of the psalmist who wrote, "Come, let us worship and bow down, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker" (Psalm 95:6).


Crying Out to God in Prayer

- Pray that people in your church will not be like the hypocrites who love to stand and pray in order to be seen by men (Matthew 6:5). Ask God to show any who may have this attitude that there is no eternal reward in that type of prideful praying.
- People often think they are too busy or life is too crowded for them to pray. For those you know who may think this way, ask God to show them that finding a quiet place for prayer was important to Jesus and should be to them as well (Mark 1:35).
- Pray that your friends will be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let their requests be made known to God (Philippians 4:6).
- Pray that your church family will learn how to pray at all times in the Spirit and will be on the alert with all perseverance in praying for all the saints (Ephesians 6:18).

- Pray that your church family will focus even more on learning how to walk in righteousness and pray effectively (James 5:16).
- 23 Spiritual activity can be wearisome to the physical body. Pray that your friends who are walking closely with Jesus will keep watching and praying that they may not enter into temptation (Matthew 26:41).
- Paul asked the Colossian believers to be devoted to prayer and to stay alert in it with an attitude of thanksgiving. Pray that your church family will do the same (Colossians 4:2).

Ministering to Others

- Pray that we will trust the Spirit to show us in very practical ways how to love our neighbors as we love ourselves (Matthew 22:39).
- Pray that your church family will be committed to the process of stimulating each other to love and good deeds (Hebrews 10:24).
- 27 Even though we were called to freedom from the law, pray that we will not turn our freedom in Christ into an opportunity to gratify the flesh, but through love will serve each other through the power of the Spirit (Galatians 5:13).
- Pray that our service to Christ will flow out of our love relationship with Him in the power of the Holy Spirit, not in religious forms to try to earn our own righteousness (Romans 7:6).
- Paul said he worked hard to present every man complete in Christ, striving according to God's power which mightily worked within him (Colossians 1:28-29). As we minister to others, pray that we too will work by God's power instead of our own.
- Ask God to guide the pastors and teachers of your church who are responsible to Him for the equipping of the saints for the work of service (Ephesians 4:11-12).
- Pray that in ministering to others, we will have the mindset of Jesus, who humbly laid down His life for our sake (Philippians 2:5-8).


