- Trusting in mankind is turning away from the Lord.
- Thorns: We respond in sinful ways to what we face in life. We have inner reasons for our sin.

Jeremiah 17:7 "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord And whose trust is the Lord.

8 "For he will be like a tree planted by the water,
That extends its roots by a stream
And will not fear when the heat comes;
But its leaves will be green,
And it will not be anxious in a year of drought
Nor cease to yield fruit.

- Cross: God meets us in our sin with His heart-transforming grace (made available to those who trust in the Lord).
- Heat: Trials, pressures, temptations, and difficulty come.
- Fruit: We respond in new ways to our old difficulties as our hearts are transformed.

"When we examine ourselves in the light of Scripture and look for Thorns that may be growing, growth in Christ results. There is an abundant supply of grace for every Thorn you identify in your life..." p. 125 How People Change

"My real problem is spiritual (my straying heart and my need for Christ). I have replaced Christ with something else, and as a consequence, my heart is hopeless and powerless. Its responses reflect its bondage to whatever it is serving instead of Christ...My real problem is a worship disorder." p. 134
