"Ecclesiastes 3:1 | For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

ummer greetings. Over the past several months we have been laying out a vision of what our ideal graduate looks like. Here is our simple four-part vision.

For our faculty and staff to partner with parents to produce ideal graduates who are 1) committed to Christ; 2) careful and creative thinkers; 3) confident communicators; and 4) citizens of virtue.

Next month I plan to address the fourth part of our vision "citizens of virtue" because in this edition of the Epistola it is important to be aware of some important changes. Please join us in praying for the school in general and people specifically as we begin another school year. We have been working hard to get things in place and ready for the start of a new school year. It is our desire to have several things in place to continue the vision and mission the Lord has given us in the area of Christian classical education.

Here are several items to know and to be praying for as it relates to our faculty.

- 1. Dr. Witte turned in his resignation letter back on May 23 citing that he and his family have made certain financial sacrifices over the last several years, and it is now necessary for him to find another job with a greater salary. The Lord has used Dr. Witte in numerous ways to educate, mature, and grow students over the last four-and-a-half years. While we are saddened to see his time here end and his academic prowess will be missed, we trust that the Lord is working out his will for Dr. Witte, his family, and CCA.
- 2. With the vacancy of Dr. Witte's position, we had to shift our schedule and staff and then seek a new faculty member who will be able to fulfill what is needed in our Upper School. The Lord has raised up and led us to a young man who we believe can fill this immediate need. His name is Riley Brashier, and he is married to one of CCA's very own graduates, Taylor (Cavett) Brashier. Mr. Brashier is a graduate of Union University, has been serving as a student minister in his home church in West Tennessee and substituting some in the public school in his small hometown.

- 3. Because of our growth, we have also hired a pre-school assistant to meet our current Pre-K needs and to provide additional support for our Pre-K director Jaimi Wright. Laurie Carlisle will be fulfilling this role and we are excited about her coming on board with her education and skill set to educate and care for the youngest of our students. Mrs. Carlisle has a Bachelor's degree from Clemson University and Master's degree from Ohio University.
- 4. As many of you know, we have been searching for an Upper School math and science faculty member. During the spring semester we had several quality interviews; and during the last few days of the school year, we were able to secure a new hire. Her name is Laura Modali, and she is a native of Indonesia. Mrs. Modali has a Bachelor's degree in physics, will complete her Master's of Art in Teaching from Liberty University this fall. She is also beginning an advanced degree in physics from Texas A&M.
- 5. We have also hired two additional parttime faculty members for our Upper School. Suzanne Lenna, who previously taught here at CCA is back after a two-year hiatus. She holds a degree from MTSU and is also the mother of Meredith Lenna, who is a graduate of CCA. Mrs. Lenna will be teaching Math 7 and Spanish 1. Another new hire, Shelli Byrnes (pronounced Burns), will expand our English department and also teach some logic and speech classes. Mrs. Byrnes holds degrees from John Brown University and St. Ambrose University and has taught at Christian schools in various countries

6. Finally, Kristal Peters recently informed us that it is necessary for her to step away from her position in 2nd grade due to some family needs connected with her husband taking a new job. If you are aware of any possible candidates, please let us know. Please be in prayer for us as we continue to seek the Lord's will and guidance in preparing for this coming academic year.

We look forward to more formal goodbyes and introductions as we draw closer to the start of the fall semester. Finally, thank you for your commitment, sacrifice, and prayers for our earnest work at Christian classical education; because without each of you, this young school could not exist.


Dear Church Family,

Heat: This is the person's situation in daily life, with difficulties, blessings and temptations.

Thorns: This is the person's ungodly response to the situation. It includes behavior, the heart driving the behavior, and the consequences that result.

<u>Cross:</u> This focuses on the presence of God in his redemptive glory and love. Through Christ, he brings comfort, cleansing, and the power to change.

Fruit: This is the person's new godly response to the situation resulting from God's power at work in the heart. It includes behavior, the heart renewed by grace, and the harvest of consequences that follow.






All those funds go towards the \$9 per shoebox shipping fee that gets the shoeboxes overseas.

Already about 300 shoeboxes have the \$9 labels on them....that's HUGE! Thank You, Candies Creek Church.











PRAYING FOR A HEALTHY CHURCH

"I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it" (Matthew 16:18 NASB).

Coming to Him as to a living stone which has been rejected by men, but is choice and precious in the sight of God, you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:4-5).

- Pray that every soul attending your church will have a right understanding of who Jesus is as both Christ (God's anointed) and Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16).
- Pray that God will build your church on the foundation of Christ and fill it with souls who are being rescued from the spiritual bondage found beyond the "gates of Hades" (Matthew 16:18).
- Pray that the "living stones" of your church family will function as priests before God, faithfully serving Him and ministering to those who are and will be a part of His eternal kingdom (1 Peter 2:5).

Proclaiming the Authority of God's Word Without Apology

- Pray that your pastor and other ministers serving in your community will be ready at all times to faithfully preach the whole counsel of the Word of God (2 Timothy 4:2).
- Knowing that in the last days men will not endure sound doctrine but will want to have their ears tickled, pray that your pastor will powerfully use the truth of God's Word to reprove, rebuke, exhort, and teach others about Christ and His kingdom (2 Timothy 4:2-4).
- As spiritually lost individuals visit your church, pray that through God's Word they will gain the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus (2 Timothy 3:15).
- Pray that when the people of your congregation hear the Word of God preached, it will be united by faith in their hearts so as to be fruitful and spiritually profitable (Hebrews 4:2).

- Pray that your Christian friends will be equipped for every good work as they consistently spend time with God, reading and studying His Word (2 Timothy 3:17).
- As God's Word faces increased rejection by our culture, pray that your church will uphold the standard that all Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, reproof, correction, and training in righteousness (2 Timothy 3:16).
- Pray that your pastor will boldly preach the cross of Christ and not rely on cleverness of speech to coerce his listeners. Pray that his messages will be presented with such godly power that it will be easy for the lost to be saved and the saved to be revived (1 Corinthians 1:17-18).

Lifting High the Name of Jesus Through Worship

- Pray that the members of your church family will be true worshipers who worship the Father in spirit and truth (John 4:24).
- Pray that Christians within your church family will present their bodies to God as a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, and that they will see this as their spiritual service of worship (Romans 12:1).
- Regardless of the honored positions some of your church members may have in your community, pray that every member will worship the Lord with reverence and rejoice before Him with trembling (Psalm 2:10-11).
- Pray that your church family will bless the Lord at all times by boasting of His greatness and continually praising and exalting His holy name (Psalm 34:1-3).

- Knowing that God's lovingkindness is better than life, pray that everyone in your church family will sense the depth of His love and openly express their praise to Him (Psalm 63:3-5).
- Pray that your church family will respond to God's great salvation in delivering us from the guilt of our sin by joyfully singing of His righteousness (Psalm 51:14).
- As the Holy Spirit continues to help us understand the Word of God, pray that we will learn to speak to each other in psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with our hearts to the Lord (Ephesians 5:18-19).

Praying Consistently According to God's Will

- Pray that all the members of your church family will be devoted to keeping alert in prayer with an attitude of thanksgiving (Colossians 4:2).
- Pray that God will lead the men of your church to spend time together in prayer, seeking His will and then praying with unified and holy hearts, without wrath or dissension (1 Timothy 2:8).
- 20 Since God knows what we need before we ask Him, pray that your church family will pray in the Spirit according to His will instead of with meaningless repetition, thinking they will be heard for their many words (Matthew 6:7-8).
- Pray that everyone in your church family will submit themselves to God's will and authority, and will therefore pray for His will to be done on earth like it is in heaven (Matthew 6:10).
- Pray that your church family will learn to spend time corporately discerning God's will before they begin praying together. Ask God to reveal His will to your church through His Word and His Holy Spirit (1 John 5:14-15).
- Pray that your Christian friends will rejoice always, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in everything, since this is God's will for us in Christ Jesus (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

24 Knowing that the effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much, pray that your church family will walk in the righteousness of Christ, confessing their sins to each other and praying for healing (James 5:16).

Sharing the Good News of Jesus with Boldness

- Pray that your church family will cry out to God for boldness and wisdom in sharing the mystery of the gospel with those who are lost (Ephesians 6:19).
- Pray that the Lord of the harvest will send Spirit-filled laborers into the neighborhoods within your community and that they will go with His anointing and power as they share the gospel with those who are lost (Luke 10:2).
- Pray that God will burden the members of your church family to go out into the highways and alleys of your city, compelling people to respond to the truth of the gospel (Luke 14:23).
- Pray that your church family will be filled with the power of the Holy Spirit and will be committed to the task of seeing the gospel message reach people in the remotest part of the earth (Acts 1:8).
- Just as John the Baptist preached the gospel using many exhortations, pray that your church family will be diligent in learning to share the gospel using a number of methods and approaches (Luke 3:18).
- Ask God to guide the pastors and teachers of your church who are responsible to Him for the equipping of the saints for the work of service (Ephesians 4:11-12).
- Pray that in ministering to others, we will have the mindset of Jesus, who humbly laid down His life for our sake (Philippians 2:5-8).
