Philosophy: The Love of Wisdom

Colossians 2:8 See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ.

In Colossians 2:8, believers are warned not to be taken captive by philosophy. Here Paul is referring to philosophy with a foundation based on human reasoning. There is another approach toward philosophy which is noble and worthy of study because it is founded on Jesus Christ. The first puffs up, rings hollow, and caters to human pride. The second leads to a knowledge of truth and reality, applying that knowledge (wisdom), and fostering humility.

What stands at much of the western academic tradition until the 19th century is a pursuit of knowledge and wisdom under the authority of Jesus Christ. The word philosophy is actually derived from two Greek words, "philia" (love) and "sophia" (wisdom). In the 4th century BC, Plato (428-348BC) founded his academy in Athens, Greece. It was the first place of higher learning in the western world. In Plato's day, there arose itinerate celebrity teachers who were paid to travel to cities and present the latest 'philosophies.' Eventually, they grew into a group known as the "Sophists" or wise ones. Their unofficial headquarters was Athens, where the latest philosophies of the day were presented (See Acts 17:18-21 or listen to Pastor Jonathan's recent messages (May 23, 30) from Acts 17).

So how does this tie into CCA and classical education? Our present culture is not that different from Paul's day. The modern-day Sophists are professors and some preachers who deny there is transcendent truth that is knowable, providing a framework for reality to be understood. That is why today if you listen close, you will hear the popular mantras "My truth" or "Your truth." At CCA, we believe and teach there is truth, and it is knowable, giving an understanding to reality. We pray and work for a revival of the pursuit of the threefold philosophical divisions evident in the Middle Ages. St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) brought about a distinctively Christian worldview to the three divisions:

- 1. 'Natural philosophy' to explore the natural world created by God.
- 2. 'Moral philosophy' is the study of man as God's image-bearer and man's relationships.
- 3. Divine philosophy' where eternal and spiritual truths are the concentration.

Pray with us as we teach and lead students to love wisdom (philosophy), not for the manipulation of knowledge to exercise one's power over others, but for truth to be applied for the good of others and the glory of Christ.



BUILDING UP THE BODY OF CHRIST

He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the **building up of the body of Christ**; until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4:11-13 NASB).

Let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, **not forsaking our own assembling together**, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near (Hebrews 10:24- 25).

- Ask God to raise up godly men in your church who will fill the roles of apostle, prophet, evangelist, and pastor teacher. Pray that God will empower them with these spiritual gifts for the good of your church and for the glory of God (Ephesians 4:11-12).
- Pray for your church's leadership to understand God's plan for equipping the saints. Pray that God will guide them as they determine the approaches and methods He would have them use in helping each person in your church family become more like Christ (Ephesians 4:11-12).
- Where there is division in your church, pray that God would equip your church leaders to develop unity among all the members through your shared faith (Ephesians 4:13).
- Pray that your congregation will not only excel in its knowledge of the Son of God, but will manifest the holy character and anointed service that is birthed out of a Spirit-filled walk with Christ (Ephesians 4:13).
- As your church gathers for worship, pray that your church leaders will have a special anointing to equip your church for the ongoing work of service throughout the week (Ephesians 4:12).
- Pray that your church family will commit to encouraging one another to pursue love and good deeds. Please pray that this pursuit will have a unifying effect on the church (Hebrews 10:24-25).
- Knowing that Christ will one day return, pray that your church will come together like never before and do everything they can to accomplish the work God has given them to do (Hebrews 10:24-25).

- Pray that Christians in your community will have Peter's boldness and declare to all men everywhere that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16).
- Fervent, corporate prayer seemed to be a common response when the New Testament believers faced difficulties or challenges (Acts 12:5). When churches in our nation face struggles from either within or without, pray that we too will turn to God with fervent, consistent, corporate prayer.
- When major decisions were made by the early church, prayer and fasting were almost always seen as a key part of the decision-making process (Acts 14:23). Pray that today's churches will understand why prayer and fasting are important and will once again return to these biblical practices.
- 11 It is so exciting to read passages like Acts 6:7, where it says, "The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly." Pray that God will graciously bring the type of revival and spiritual awakening where these wonderful occurrences will once again become the norm.
- Sadly, there are many people who have left the church. As your church family gathers for worship, pray that God's Spirit will stir the hearts of those who have left to repent and return to seek God together with His body (Hebrews 10:25).
- Pray that God will protect our churches from "savage wolves"—individuals within the church who speak "perverse things" in order to have church members follow them (Acts 20:29-30).

- Dealing with Christian brothers or sisters who openly sin (Matthew 18:15-18), and responding to "so-called" brothers who live immorally (1 Corinthians 5:9-13), are not easy steps to take. Pray that your church family will know best how to apply God's Word when helping others experience victory over sin and find restoration.
- Pray that God will help the new believers in your church to put aside "all malice and all deceit and hypocrisy and envy and all slander" and "like newborn babies, long for the pure milk of the word," in order to "grow in respect to salvation" (1 Peter 2:1-2).
- Realizing that the Christians in your church family are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, and a holy nation, pray that more than ever before they will boldly proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called them out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Peter 2:9).
- Pray for your church's pastors, elders, and staff to shepherd your church family according to the will of God, providing good examples for the flock (1 Peter 5:2-3).
- Even as Paul was committed to making mature followers of Christ, pray that God will raise up faithful men and women among your church who will be able to entrust to others the spiritual truths they themselves have received (2 Timothy 2:2).
- As your church gathers for worship, pray that each member will see themselves as a unique and necessary part of the body of Christ (Romans 12:5).
- Pray that the sacrificial love Jesus has for the church will be clearly modeled in the relationship each husband in your church family has with his wife (Ephesians 5:25).
- Pray that the wives in your church family will model the kind of submissive respect toward their husbands that exemplifies the way the church should be submitting to Christ Jesus (Ephesians 5:24, 33).
- Pray that the churches in your community will all be strengthened in their commitment to walk with Jesus and will see new believers added to their number daily (Acts 16:5).
- Pray that the churches in your community will abound in faith, boldness, knowledge, love, and giving to support the work of the kingdom of God (2 Corinthians 8:7).

- Pray that any churches in your community that have left their first love for Jesus will remember from where they have fallen, repent, and then return to the loving obedience they had at first (Revelation 2:5).
- As churches the world over face greater levels of persecution, pray that God's people will not be fearful, but will remain faithful to Him regardless of the severity of the tests (Revelation 2:9-10).
- The church at Pergamum stands in Scripture as an example of how a church family can commit idolatry, engage in immorality, and even put stumbling blocks before those to whom it should be ministering (Revelation 2:14). Pray that churches will not allow pride to blind them of their sins, but will humbly and repentantly allow God's Spirit to examine their ways and deeds.
- The church at Sardis thought it was alive, but according to Jesus, it was spiritually dead (Revelation 3:1-2). Pray that the churches who are just going through the motions of Christianity but exhibit no real signs of spiritual life will wake up and "strengthen the things that remain." Pray that they will press on in obeying God's commands and completing His purposes.
- 28 Like the church in Laodicea, some churches today are lukewarm in their love for Jesus. Pray that the church in your community will not become blind and apathetic, saying, "I am rich, and have become wealthy, and have need of nothing" (Revelation 3:16-17). Pray that these churches will see themselves like Jesus sees them and repent.
- Jesus' love for His church is so great that He says in Revelation 3:19, "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent." Pray that your church family will not run from God's discipline, but will zealously embrace His judgments and make any changes He desires.
- How many times has God stood at the door of His church knocking, only to have no one hear His voice and open the door (Revelation 3:20)? Pray that the churches in your community will continually listen for the voice of God, keeping the door of communication, obedience, and fellowship open.
