The Third Art of the Trivium: Rhetoric

And he reasoned in the synagogue every Sabbath, and tried to persuade Jews and Greeks. - Acts 18:4

The final pathway of the Trivium (three ways) is called Rhetoric. The focus and development of this stage happen in the 9-12th grades. Rhetoric dates back to Aristotle, the Greek philosopher (384-322 BC), who wrote an entire book titled "On Rhetoric." In his book, he defines rhetoric as the power of seeing all the available means of persuasion concerning a particular subject or situation.

From Greek, to Roman, to Middle Ages, to Renaissance, and finally, the Modern period, rhetoric has been defined or understood in various ways. For example, during the Renaissance, rhetoric was simply understood as the art of eloquence in what we would call poetry. Today, popular American culture recognizes rhetoric as extreme exaggeration lacking genuine sincerity and minimal truth. CCA is interested in teaching rhetoric in a classical or traditional sense. The goal for our students to develop the ability to speak and write persuasively with truth as their governor.

The rhetoric stage traditionally consists of five canons. These are not the large-caliber cannons used during wars from the 14th to 19th centuries. "Canon" comes from a Greek word that means principle or law. So, there are five principles or laws found in the rhetoric stage.

The first canon is invention (inventio), which is merely coming up with an idea or argument to be communicated. The canon of arrangement (dipositio) is the skill where the idea or argument is organized to make the message clear to the audience. Then comes the canon of style (elocutio) is the skill of choosing the best way to deliver the message to impact the reader or listener. The fourth canon is memory (memoria) which involves the presenter's knowledge and understanding of the idea or argument. The final canon is delivery (pronuntiatio), which consists of the skill to speak or write well.

To achieve our desired goal of graduating students who will speak and write persuasively with truth as their governor, the prior pathways of the Trivium are essential. Kevin Clark and Ravi Jain say it well. "The rhetorician's training begins in the earliest days of grammar education: delighting in what is beautifully said, whether in poetry, literature, drama, or Scripture, and memorizing the same. Copious oral reading of stories, Scripture, poems, nursery rhymes, etc., is essential." To summarize the Trivium, we begin PreK-5th grades with the Grammar stage, pointing them to the tools of knowledge. We then move to the 6th-8th grades to develop the tools of reasoning, which culminates in the 9-12th grades with the tools of communication.

John 1:4 In Him was life, and the life was the Light of mankind.

John 8:12 Then Jesus again spoke to them, saying, "I am the Light of the world; the one who follows Me will not walk in the darkness, but will have the Light of life."


John 12:46 I have come as Light into the world, so that no one who believes in Me will remain in darkness. (New American Standard Bible-1995)

PRAYING OVER YOUR CITY

When [Jesus] approached Jerusalem, He saw the city and wept over it, saying, "If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes" (Luke 19:41-42 NASB).

When it goes well with the righteous, the city rejoices, and when the wicked perish, there is joyful shouting. By the blessing of the upright a city is exalted, but by the mouth of the wicked it is torn down (Proverbs 11:10-11).

- When you think about the individuals and families in your city who are missing a love relationship with Jesus, do you ever weep over their spiritual condition? Pray that Christians in your city will have the same kind of loving heart Jesus does for those living around us (Luke 19:41).
- Pray that the Spirit of Christ will free those in your city whose eyes have been blinded by the darkness of sin. Pray that they will be able to clearly see the light of the gospel and be saved (2 Corinthians 4:4).
- All over the country, Christians are being awakened to the growing sinfulness found within our culture. Pray that we will not lose hope, but will unite in fervent prayer, trusting God to push back the darkness and bring national revival (2 Corinthians 4:6).
- Cities are often exalted as God blesses the "upright" within those cities. Pray that God will exalt your city by powerfully blessing those who are faithful in their walk with Him (Proverbs 11:11).
- Historically, God often brings burdened individuals together to pray prior to seasons of revival. Pray that He will unite the believers in your church and city in crying out to Him for revival and spiritual awakening (Acts 4:31).
- In Acts 19, the followers of Christ living in Ephesus came together publicly to confess as wrong their involvement in the occult and to burn the books related to this topic. Pray that the believers in your city will be just as bold in turning away from sin and turning back to Christ.
- Since God gives grace to the humble, pray that Christians throughout your city will bow before the Lord daily and receive the grace needed to live victoriously through Him (James 4:6).

- Some people place a lot of self-exalting pride in their neighborhoods and communities. Pray that a spirit of godly humility will sweep over your city and that people will walk humbly before God and each other (Micah 6:8).
- Pray that the Christian husbands and wives of your city will walk humbly before each other in order for their prayers not to be hindered (1 Peter 3:7).
- Pray that the younger Christians in your city will be clothed with humility and will respect and honor their elders (1 Peter 5:5).
- As times of crisis engulf our cities and communities, pray that people will make the connection between God's remedial judgments and our sins. Pray that these crises will serve as reminders of what we deserve apart from God's mercy (Titus 3:5).
- Just as Daniel humbled himself as he confessed the sins of the Hebrew nation, pray that God's people will assume responsibility for the moral and spiritual erosion in our nation and will then lead their communities in repentance (Daniel 9).
- Pray that God's holy presence will be deeply experienced as the churches within your city gather for worship (2 Chronicles 5:14).
- 14 Instead of becoming anxious in the midst of life's pressures, pray that your church family will learn to cast their cares on the Lord (Philippians 4:6).
- Pray that Christians all throughout your city will seek first God's kingdom and righteousness before physically getting involved in their work each day (Matthew 6:33).

- Pray for the fathers in your city to know and follow Jesus, modeling a love for their wives and children that reflects the type of love Jesus has for the church (Ephesians 5:25).
- God is always looking for righteous intercessors who are willing to stand in the gap on behalf of their cities and their nation. Pray that more and more committed intercessors will arise from the churches of your city (Ezekiel 22:30).
- Pray that God will give your church's leadership and members a fresh vision of genuinely becoming a praying church (Matthew 21:13).
- Pray that the adult Christians in your city will consistently model seeking the Lord in all things and that the younger generations will find strength and hope in the Lord as they too become committed to seeking Him (Acts 17:26-27).
- All over your city, Christians are being challenged with circumstances that are testing their faith in God and the promises of His Word. Pray that their faith in God's ability to do what He has said He will do on their behalf will rise (Hebrews 11:6).
- 21 Many nations depend on their political power, military strength, financial might, technological resources, medical advancements, and educational institutions to solve difficulties. Pray that we as a people will put our trust in God alone as our deliverer (Zechariah 4:6).
- Pray that the Christians in your city will forsake any attitudes of self-sufficiency and will acknowledge their tremendously desperate need for God (John 15:5).
- In many churches and communities, the fear of man is a major influence in the decisions being made. Pray that in your city, Christians will have a healthy, biblical fear of God and will continually seek His heart regarding direction and decisions (Proverbs 1:7; 9:10).

- Pray that every member of the churches in your city will acknowledge the importance of knowing and applying God's Word in their daily lives (Psalm 119:9-11).
- Pray that the people of your city will see sin like God sees it and will refuse to accept any type of moral stance that is contrary to the clear teachings of God's Word (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
- Pray that Christians in your city will be filled with a desire to memorize and meditate on God's Word (Psalm 119:15-16).
- Pray that churches in your city will demonstrate genuine repentance in response to personal and corporate sin. Pray that submission to the lordship of Christ will become the norm (2 Corinthians 7:9-10).
- In Matthew 5:14, Jesus taught that His followers will be "the light of the world" and that "a city set on a hill cannot be hidden." Pray that the life and light of Jesus will shine through the lives of Christians in your city and that many will see Him and be saved.
- Pray that Christians in your city will become committed to personal, daily prayer that is effective and wholeheartedly centered in the will of God (James 5:16).
- Pray that the Christians of your city will unite in praying for those who are in authority over them and consequently will be blessed of God by being able to experience quiet and peaceful lives (1 Timothy 2:1-2).
- Pray for your city to experience revival and spiritual awakening. Pray that the kind of heart that moved Jesus to weep over Jerusalem will be found in us as we make a renewed commitment to pray for our cities (Acts 2:41).
