The Careful & Creative Thinker

See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ (Colossians 2:8).

n February's newsletter, CCA laid out its vision for the ideal graduate:

"It is the goal of the faculty and staff at Candies Creek Academy (CCA) to partner with parents to produce ideal graduates who are 1) committed to Christ; 2) critical thinkers; 3) confident communicators; and 4) citizens of virtue."

This month we are turning our attention to "critical thinkers."

The term "critical thinkers" sounds good, but I assume most of us would fail at adequately defining it. After researching the term in preparation for this article and using some of my own "critical thinking," I believe it will serve CCA better to steer clear of this amorphous term for another that is more specific and carries less baggage. "Critical thinking" is not only a nebulous concept, it was popularized by the progressive humanist educator John Dewey (1859-1952), who also called it by the name "reflective thinking."

Classical education largely stands in opposition to the educational reforms of John Dewey, who argued that "reflective thinking" is

"active, persistent and careful consideration of any belief or supposed form of knowledge in the light of the grounds that support it, and the further conclusions to which it tends."

This definition supports his philosophy of naturalism. Naturalism suggests that the avenue to truth is exclusively by way of scientific, empirical facts. Classical Christian educators, meanwhile, believe humans are made in the image of God and students' thinking cannot be reduced to repeated exercises of scientific inquiry. Therefore, "careful and creative thinker" is a better description of our ideal graduate at CCA.

Thinking starts when we are presented with a problem or identify discord. Socrates (470-399BC) has been quoted as saying, "Great is the power of contradiction," implying that contradiction is the power that stimulates thought. So what is meant by producing students who are "careful and creative thinkers?"

Careful thinking begins by arranging data within a moral framework to determine what is true, making a judgment possible to create a harmonious solution.

This may sound simple and straight forward. But we know real world problems do not always fit into easy-to-define categories. This is where creative thinking needs to begin by assessing the problem or discord from various vantage points to find workable solutions

A simple three-step process of thought — from careful thinking to creative thinking and back to careful thinking should be used until a true, harmonious, and workable solution is provided. We must ask: Is it true? Is there harmony?, Is it workable? If not, then the three-step process must be repeated.

In a world awash with moral, physical, social, and technological disunity, there is no lack for the need to think carefully and creatively through issues, seeking that in every thing God may be glorified through Jesus Christ (1 Peter 4:11).

To conclude, we now see our ideal graduate slightly different than when we began. It is the goal of the faculty and staff at Candies Creek Academy (CCA) to partner with parents to produce ideal graduates who are 1) committed to Christ; 2) careful and creative learners; 3) confident communicators; and 4) citizens of virtue

We invite you to join us in our efforts to produce graduates who will think carefully and creatively by praying for and giving to CCA. We need prayer leaders who are willing to guide prayer teams that deliver thanksgiving and requests to God regarding the Academy.

Additionally, we need givers who can commit to a regular, consistent time to help students and staff, as well as those who can help provide for the school's financial needs.

In the days ahead, we plan to emphasize our Dana Work Scholarship fund. This scholarship fund is specifically designed to help families and students who demonstrate a financial need. We always have more requests for aid than we are able to meet. So, would you consider giving to the good and just cause in preparing future generations to be committed to Christ, careful and creative thinkers, confident communicators, and citizens of virtue?



I (We) are so excited to be here and worship the "Lord our Maker" together with you church family.





LIVING BY THE SPIRIT

"'AND IT SHALL BE IN THE LAST DAYS,' GOd Says, 'THAT I WILL POUR FORTH OF MY SPIRIT ON ALL MANKIND; AND YOUR SONS AND YOUR DAUGHTERS SHALL PROPHESY, AND YOUR YOUNG MEN SHALL SEE VISIONS, AND YOUR OLD MEN SHALL DREAM DREAMS; EVEN ON MY BONDSLAVES, BOTH MEN AND WOMEN, I WILL IN THOSE DAYS POUR FORTH OF MY SPIRIT AND THEY SHALL PROPHESY. AND I WILL GRANT WONDERS IN THE SKY ABOVE AND SIGNS ON THE EARTH BELOW, BLOOD, AND FIRE, AND VAPOR OF SMOKE. THE SUN WILL BE TURNED INTO DARKNESS AND THE MOON INTO BLOOD, BEFORE THE GREAT AND GLORIOUS DAY OF THE LORD SHALL COME. AND IT SHALL BE THAT EVERYONE WHO CALLS ON THE NAME OF THE LORD WILL BE SAVED'" (Acts 2:17-21 NASB).

John answered and said to them all, "As for me, I baptize you with water; but One is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to untie the thong of His sandals; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Luke 3:16).

- In Acts 2, the disciples saw the fulfillment of God pouring forth His Spirit on all mankind. Pray that God's Spirit will be free to work powerfully though your church to see His kingdom come and His will be done.
- At Pentecost, three thousand souls were saved, baptized, and added to the fellowship of those initial believers. Pray that God will do another mighty work that brings in a great harvest of souls (Acts 2:41).
- Pray that the Holy Spirit will be so powerfully present in our lives and churches that it will be easy for the lost around us to come to know Christ as Savior and Lord (Acts 2:37-38).
- In John 16:8, we see that the Holy Spirit convicts the lost of sin, righteousness, and judgment. Ask God to send His Spirit to do this saving work in the life of someone you know.
- Today is the National Day of Prayer! Ask God to soften hearts within our nation that we as a people may turn back to love, obey, and worship Him alone.
- In Stephen's message just before his death, he described his accusers as stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart, always resisting the Holy Spirit (Acts 7:51). Pray that the lost in your community will not resist the Holy Spirit but will be open to His convicting work.
 - In Acts 8:29, God's Spirit told Philip to go join the chariot of an Ethiopian eunuch. Through Philip's witness, this court official was saved. Pray that your church family will be alert today in hearing the Spirit's voice and obeying His commands, especially when it involves witnessing to the lost.

- In many churches, we have so grieved the Spirit of God through our lack of faith that little eternal work is being accomplished. Pray that churches will no longer grieve the Holy Spirit but will trust God to accomplish through His abiding power all that He commands us to do (Ephesians 4:30).
- In preparation for going to Cornelius' house, Peter was told by the Spirit that three men would be looking for him and that he was to accompany them (Acts 10:19-20). Pray that Christians today will be this sensitive to the specific instructions God's Spirit gives us regarding our daily activities.
- In giving counsel to the newly converted Gentile believers, the church leaders in Jerusalem stated in Acts 15:28 that their decisions seemed good to the Holy Spirit. Pray that your church family and leaders will seek the Holy Spirit's direction and approval as they make decisions.
- Since the mind set on the flesh is death, pray that Christians all over the country will set their minds on the Spirit of God, experiencing life and peace (Romans 8:6).
- According to Romans 8:14, all who are being led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. Pray that your church family will understand their identity with Christ and will make the choice daily to put to death the immoral deeds of the flesh (Romans 8:13-14).
- Just as in the natural world fire can be a cleansing agent, pray that the purifying fire of the Holy Spirit will first enlighten our minds to see the presence of sin in our lives and then burn away every desire we have for walking in the flesh (Hebrews 12:29).

- Ask God to help your church family to pray at all times in the Spirit and to be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints (Ephesians 6:18).
- In John 16:7, Jesus called the Holy Spirit the Helper. Pray for someone you know today who needs the help or comfort only the Holy Spirit can give.
- In John 16:13-14, Jesus said the Holy Spirit would glorify Him by taking what comes directly from Jesus and passing it along to us. Pray that your church family will so walk in the Spirit that the glory of Jesus will be magnified with every decision and action.
- Paul understood that through our union with Christ, our flesh has been crucified, and we have been raised to walk in newness of life (Galatians 2:20; Romans 6:4). Pray that today's church will grasp the truth that because of Christ's death and resurrection, we can become completely new.
- Pray that Christians in your community will daily reckon themselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus (Romans 6:11).
- Pray that Christians everywhere will learn to walk in the Spirit in order to not carry out the sinful desires of the flesh (Galatians 5:16).
- Walking in the Spirit enables a Christian to be able to confess, "Jesus is Lord!" (1 Corinthians 12:3). Pray that the church will experience the kind of in-depth revival that moves Christians to live completely under the lordship of Christ.
- 21 Knowing exactly what your church family needs in order to function well, God gives spiritual gifts to your church's members for the common good (1 Corinthians 12:7). Pray that your fellow church members will know, understand, and use their spiritual gifts for the glory of God.
- Pray that your local congregation will truly function as the unified body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12).
- Pray that churches facing conflict and division over the use of spiritual gifts will pursue the "more excellent way" of love described in 1 Corinthians 13. Pray that church members will prioritize the fruit of the Holy Spirit in their individual lives above His manifestational gifts corporately.

- Pray that your church family will recognize and turn away from the deeds of the flesh: immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these (Galatians 5:19-21).
- Pray that your church family will powerfully manifest the fruit of God's Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23).
- Pray that your Christian friends will walk by the Spirit and not become boastful, challenging or envying one another (Galatians 5:25-26).
- Pray for the church in America to become so repulsed by the corruption that comes from walking in the flesh that it makes a greater commitment to sow to the Spirit (Galatians 6:8).
- Pray that the church will come to see the Bible as "the sword of the Spirit" and will train to become more proficient in handling it (Ephesians 6:17).
- What a blessing it is to know that, along with Jesus, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us according to the will of God (Romans 8:27, 34). Thank God today for giving us such wonderful intercessors!
- The Spirit has warned us that in the later times some will fall away from the faith, paying attention to deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons (1 Timothy 4:1). In light of this warning, let's pray for the spiritual protection of our families, churches, and communities.
- John was under great physical and spiritual oppression on the Island of Patmos; yet Revelation 1:10 says he was in the Spirit on the Lord's day. Pray that no matter how challenging things become for followers of Jesus, we will continue to live and walk in submission to the Holy Spirit.
