

### Theology: The Queen of the Sciences

"All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men" (John 1:3-4).

During the Medieval period (c. 476-1400 AD), when classical education was systemized into the Trivium (i.e., grammar, logic, and rhetoric stage) and the Quadrivium (i.e., arithmetic, geometry, astronomy, and music stage), Theology was named "the Queen of the Sciences." It sounds strange to our modern ears to hear Theology—that is, the study of the divine and religious beliefs—being called a "science." In contemporary thought, "science" refers to the scientific method, which many claim can only be used to examine the material world. The realm of the immaterial or supernatural seems to be beyond the investigative power of "science."

This narrow view of the application of the scientific method is the result of secular ideas that emerged during the Age of Reason, also called the "Enlightenment" (c. 1685-1815). Notable thinkers like Immanuel Kant divided the thought world into two categories, referred to simply as feeling and fact. "Feelings" are those thoughts and beliefs that are true for me, and for me only. According to this view, emotions, morality, religious beliefs, art theory, etc., were placed in the category of feelings. "Facts," meanwhile, would include conclusions in fields of study such as astronomy, architecture, economics, biology, chemistry, etc., that applied to the material world and were supported by the scientific method. That is to say, only conceptions that could be examined via the scientific method, produced within those disciplines that investigated the material world, were accorded the honor of being called "facts."

Yet, this misconception has at least three flaws.

First, it falsely assumes that the scientific method can only be employed to make factual deductions about the material world. However, there are numerous concepts with which scientists interact that help ground the modern scientific method that are both real and immaterial. These include advanced concepts of mathematics, the laws of nature, concepts of aesthetics, etc. Although immaterial, these are nonetheless real; they are both perceivable and conceivable and, therefore, real. Thus, claims that the scientific method cannot be used to make conclusions about the immaterial world, that observations and beliefs about the immaterial world cannot be "facts," or that the material world is the only real world are flawed propositions. Based on this, theological concepts can be "fact" like any other scientific claim.

Second, if we think more broadly, the very term "science" comes from the Latin word *scientia*, which simply means "knowledge." We can understand science as an area of study of a particular object through systematic study and investigation, regardless of whether that object is material or immaterial.

Third, consider the suffix of many of the modern physical and social sciences, such as biology, anthropology, psychology, sociology, physiology, etc. What is the common suffix? The suffix, "-ology," which comes from the Greek word, *logos*, meaning, "a word, idea, or concept." Theology is a word, idea, concept about God. It is a broad science with numerous subcategories like Christology, pneumatology, hamartiology, soteriology, eschatology, etc. Theology may not be a hard, empirical science; but it is a form of science nonetheless. Theology relies on Scripture as its guide, and it makes factual statements and objective truth claims that are not personal beliefs but rather universal facts: "Your word is truth" (John 17:17).


At CCA, we consider Theology to be the "Queen of the Sciences," as did our pedagogical forerunners. What does that mean for our students? Theology is not taught simply by adding a few Bible courses to our curriculum or by integrating Theology into various subjects like history or literature. Nor do we merely encourage practical Christian habits like reading devotionals and praying. Theology is the foundation and *telos* (i.e., end, goal, aim) of all curriculum and all Christian living.

With Theology as both our foundation and aim, we can live out together the teaching of Paul in Colossians 2:8: "See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ."



### EXPOSING DARKNESS AND WALKING CAREFULLY IN THE LIGHT

Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even expose them; for it is disgraceful even to speak of the things which are done by them in secret. But all things become visible when they are exposed by the light, for everything that becomes visible is light. For this reason it says, "Awake, sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you." Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil (Ephesians 5:11-16 NASB).

- Our culture and the world system in which we live make it easy for Christians to passively get caught up in the spiritually dark ways of the world. Pray that Christians will recognize these ways and refuse to participate in any unfruitful deeds of darkness (Ephesians 5:11).
- As you look toward gathering with the body of Christ locally, ask God to expose and correct any falsehood or deceit being propagated within the churches in your community (Proverbs 30:8a).
- Over the past few decades, the truths found in the Bible seem to have lost their place as the standard for morality in our nation. Pray that church leaders and believers from all over our country will boldly use God's Word to expose sin and uphold righteousness (Ephesians 5:12-13).
- The lost in our country and many backslidden Christians seem to be asleep when it comes to living according to the will and ways of God. Pray that a powerful revival and spiritual awakening will come to our land, shaking worldliness out of believers and drawing the lost to Jesus (Ephesians 5:14).
- Pray that Christians will be careful how they live out their Christianity. Pray that they will long for and seek the wisdom that comes from above, that can shape and guide a person to live like Jesus (Ephesians 5:15).
- As the sinful allurements and temptations of the world become more subtly pervasive, pray that Christians will not waste their time on sinful pursuits, but will instead give every minute to an obedient love relationship with Jesus (Ephesians 5:16).

- The foolish man consistently fails to acknowledge God or to live according to the principles of His Word. Pray that the members of your church family will lay aside foolishness and will continually seek to understand the will of the Lord (Ephesians 5:17).
- Pray that every member of your congregation will find victory over the desires of the flesh by walking according to the Spirit (Galatians 5:16).
- As your church gathers, ask God to give your pastor unique discernment of the Holy Spirit's activity among you (Galatians 5:25).
- Pray that your church family will walk in love, just as Christ also loved us and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma (Ephesians 5:2).
- The Bible tells us that everyone who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed (John 3:20). Pray that the lost in your city will humbly recognize that because of their sins, they need a Savior. Pray that they will be drawn to the light of Jesus.
- People often try to hide their sins from others. Pray that your church family will eagerly confess their sins publicly and pray for each other, especially when that sin has resulted in sickness (James 5:16).
- Pray that "no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ" (Colossians 2:8).

- Pray that the members of your congregation will be careful to not become a stumbling block to others. Ask God to give them the grace to do everything for the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31-32).
- 15 It is easy for those in the world to "love what is worthless and aim at deception" (Psalm 4:2). Pray that the Christians in your community will genuinely love Jesus and lay aside any worthless and deceptive ways.
- As in days of old, there are some preachers today who are speaking falsehood—teachings that have not come from God or His Word (Jeremiah 14:14). Pray that these "false prophets" will be exposed and that God will lead those under their care into the truth.
- When the Hebrews obeyed God's commands, He promised that it would be well with them and with their children (Deuteronomy 12:28). Pray that Christians within our nation will be careful to obey everything God has commanded us to do as His children.
- When someone refuses to love the truth that leads to salvation, they become susceptible to the deception of wickedness (2 Thessalonians 2:10). Pray that the lost in your community will be delivered from this deception and will be able to love the truth about Jesus and be saved.
- Pray that Christians in your community will be careful to keep God's commands, not careless in their ways to live however seems best to them (Proverbs 19:16).
- Pray that your church family will be protected from those who "cause dissensions and hindrances" by departing from the sound teaching of God's Word. Pray that their wrong reasoning will be exposed in order to protect "the hearts of the unsuspecting" (Romans 16:17-18).
- Being careful to lay no foundation other than the one which is laid, which is Jesus Christ, pray that each person within your church family will be careful how he builds on it (1 Corinthians 3:10-11).

- The Bible warns us that many will follow the depravity of false prophets. Pray that your church will be known throughout the community as a place where truth is valued and unashamedly proclaimed (2 Peter 2:2).
- Pray that your church family will honor what is spoken to them in God's name, examine it carefully, hold fast to what is good, and abstain from every form of evil (1 Thessalonians 5:21-22).
- Pray that your church family will be careful to not let sexual immorality or any impurity or greed be found among you, but will rather act properly as God's children (Ephesians 5:3).
- Pray that your church family will be careful to avoid participating in obscene conversations and dirty jokes, but will rather use their words to give thanks to God (Ephesians 5:4).
- Pray that your church family will not be deceived but hold to the truth that "the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God." Pray that your church will accept the unpopular truth of 1 Corinthians 6:9-10.
- Pray that more and more people in your community will be washed, sanctified, and justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God (1 Corinthians 6:11).
- Pray that your church family will engage in good deeds and avoid contentious and controversial arguments that accomplish nothing (Titus 3:8-9).
- Pray that your congregation and its leaders will recognize divisive individuals and dismiss them if they continue to sow dissention after being warned and corrected (Titus 3:10-11).
- Pray for your Christian friends to live in submission to authority, to be obedient and ready for every good work, to malign no one, and to be peaceable and gentle, showing consideration for everyone (Titus 3:1-2).
- Pray that God will move on your congregation today, searching and trying every heart, revealing any anxious thoughts or hurtful ways. Pray that repentance will take place and that genuine revival will be experienced by the people of your church family (Psalm 139:23-24).
