



Giving and Serving for His Glory

⁶ The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷ Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:6–7 (ESV)

he scriptures often mention farming principles: The ground must be prepared, the seeds must be sown, and the natural elements of sun, heat, water, and wind must work while the farmer waits. He does not passively wait but actively watches, looking for growth and maturity with a view to an expected harvest. After the harvest, the cycle is repeated the following season.

CCBC and friends of CCA, you have a unique opportunity to participate in cultivating young hearts and minds through Christ-centered, classical education. We celebrate those who faithfully give to the ministries of CCBC and further celebrate those who give "as he has decided in his heart" to specific CCA funds. This past summer season, we had a goal of \$15,000 for the Dana Work Scholarship. We are thrilled to share that we exceeded our goal with a total of \$19,525 through nineteen giving units.

Those dollars are not the harvest but rather the seeds that are sown. We get to wait and watch what the Lord will do to bring about a harvest of families whose hearts' desire for their children to receive a Christ-centered, classical education. We look forward with anticipation to seeing how the Lord uses the faculty and staff of CCA to forge young hearts and minds to seek, follow, obey, and pass along the commands of Christ

We want to share one story of how your gifts to the Dana Work Scholarship Fund have made a difference. This past month, we learned of a family at CCA who are committed to giving their child a Christian classical education; however, they could only afford for their student to attend part-time. Month to month, they were coming up short by a couple of hundred dollars in their personal budget. When we learned of the potential need, we approached them and encouraged them to apply for the Dana Work scholarship. They completed the application, and because of the dollars in the scholarship fund, we were able to award them enough financial assistance for their student to enroll full-time and reduce their monthly tuition bill by more than \$200.

When we told this family they had been awarded the scholarship and how it would affect their monthly tuition bill, they shed tears of joy. The story is not over because now we look forward to how God will mature and grow this young family and their student for His glory. Thus, we wait for the harvest and trust that whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.

This month, there is another opportunity for you to invest in our school, students, and international missions. Beginning in October, we will start a discipleship fundraiser called Feed the Need. We will raise money for CCA by becoming a packing site to pack 10,000 meals that will eventually be shipped to Bangladesh. CCA and CCBC families can register to help raise money and participate in the packing party that will occur on Friday, November 22. We will have our Kickoff Chapel on Wednesday, October 16, at 11 am. During this chapel, we will share with the students our plan to pack 10,000 meals for people in need in Bangladesh. Rick Adolph, whose parents were missionaries to Bangladesh while he was growing up, will also share with our students the physical and spiritual needs in the country. On Thursday, October 17, at 3 pm, we will be registering families to help raise funds for CCA and awareness of the needs in Bangladesh.

Please pray about joining us in this effort. If everyone participates at some level and seeks to be a cheerful giver, we believe we will exceed our \$35,000 goal. What is beautiful about the Feed the Need campaign is that it turns our students'

attention toward others' needs rather than what reward or gain they can attain. We believe serving others is a key principle in discipleship.

Consider the words and example of the Lord Jesus. "For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45), and "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you" (John 13:14–15).

Over time, our students will forget about the dollars raised, but they likely will not forget that one year, they helped their school pack 10,000 meals for people in need in Bangladesh.

Dear Kingdom Citizens,

I praise God to be part of a church family that is committed to **the Bible** being **our authority** as individuals and as a church body. It has been said for several decades or more that the word will keep you from sin or sin will keep you from the word. We keep a few mega themes from the Bible highlighted now: particularly **King—Glory—Gospel**.

In 2024, pray that by grace we will rehearse, apply and share the gospel. Pastor Jonathan often reminded us about applying the gospel to life until it becomes a lifestyle. In March, April and May, some community groups used Gospel 101 by Jeff Dodge which uses a subtitle of Learning, Living and Sharing the Gospel. As we move into the last three months of the year, we want to invite everyone, through our community group leaders and the ministry leaders of our affinity groups (examples choir, student ministry & women's ministry), to take the month of October to pray for God to put two people on your heart who you are spiritually burdened for. The vision team has a goal for there to be 150 people spiritually burdened for two people that they have named (but you don't have to share the names). The two people God puts on your heart may be lost or may already be following Christ. Our prayer is that the lost and those already following Christ will grow in their understanding of God's glory and the gospel.

We recognize that many of you may already be spiritually burdened for more than two people, and you can use someone that you are already spiritually burdened for. **It is exciting to think about**:

- our congregation <u>focusing everyone on this at the same time</u> through our community groups and many ministries (affinity groups).
- the growth that we can experience and share as <u>fellow workers</u>.
- God using October and the end of 2024 as <u>a building block for the rest of our lives</u>, especially considering God's glory and the rich 190 year heritage of Candies Creek Baptist Church.

Seeing More

Faith sees more than the physical.

In 2 Kings, Chapter 6, scripture tells us how the prophet Elisha enraged the king of Aram by warning the king of Israel about the Arameans' plans for attack against Israel. When the king of Aram learned who was keeping his military raids from being successful, he ordered his men—not just a few men, but "horses and chariots and a great army "(6:14)—to find Elisha and take him. When Elisha's servant saw that the city they were in was surrounded by the enemy's mighty army, he feared for his and Elisha's lives. But Elisha told him not to fear, "for those who are with us are more than those who are with them." (6:16) All the servant could see was the physical presence of a fearsome foe, but Elisha's eyes of faith saw more, so he "prayed and said, 'O Lord, I pray, open his eyes that he may see.' And the Lord opened the servant's eyes and he saw; and behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha." (6:17) It was a host of angels waiting to do God's bidding.

When Jesus came upon a blind man on the road to Jericho, the blind man called out to him despite others telling him to keep quiet, and Jesus asked him what he wanted. His reply was I want to see. And so he did. His prayerful request based on his faith in Jesus resulted in his restored ability to see. (Luke 18:35-43)

We know from Psalm 119 that God's word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path, enabling us to see through the eyes of faith who we are in Christ and in Whom we trust because of His great mercy and abundant grace. Scripture assures us in the book of Colossians that we will see more through faith as we set our minds on things above, not on earthly things, and as we devote ourselves to prayer, staying alert in it with thanksgiving. (Colossians 3 & 4) And in 1 John 3, we are beautifully encouraged to see what great love the Father has given us that we should be called God's children, and we are.

How often do we allow the trials and challenges of life to paralyze us with fear or dread, or even the mundane circumstances of life to stymie our gratitude and joy, because all we can see is the immediate difficulty or dullness, and it hinders us from seeing more? Perhaps we should practice interceding for each other and requesting for ourselves eyes of faith that can see far more, like the prayerful first line of a 19th century hymn written by Clara Scott:

"Open my eyes, that I may see glimpses of truth Thou hast for me."
